Where we've come from

Christ Church was formed on 1st September 2003 when, after a lot of preparation and a time of growing together, Hipperholme Methodist Church and Lightcliffe United Reformed Church joined. Both churches were convinced that the work of God in Hipperholme and Lightcliffe could be



done better together.

At the inaugural service on 7th September, we built a cairn of stones – a marker for the path we were travelling together. Worship alternated between the two sites we owned whilst we juggled plans for the

refurbishment of the crossroads site and Calderdale's plans for the junction. October 2005 saw worship move to the Lightcliffe Site and

work start at the crossroads to ensure we had a building fit to be used for our mission.

On Advent Sunday, 3rd December 2006 we moved back to the crossroads and the butterfly flew around the building during the service – new life had been born.





Many new initiatives were started – some are still growing and others served a purpose and then were allowed to finish.

Through all this time we were led and guided by Revd Ruth Gee until she left in July 2008. Ministry switched to the URC and after a year's interregnum, Revd Patrick Taylor was welcomed on 23rd August 2009.

We place a great importance on ministry as this is what feeds us and helps us to grow in our faith, which in turn enables our mission.

The managing trustees of Christ Church are our Leadership Team of 12 members plus the treasurer and the Minister and we have a Church Secretary rather than a Senior Steward.

Where we are now... Christ Church is a busy place so it's hard to know where we are 'now'!

Christ Church is a worshipping community which seeks to witness to Christ through fellowship, service and outreach and to develop knowledge and understanding of God in today's world.


